Workshop

Why is it important to edit your thesis? How do you approach it? When should you start? Developing a capacity to edit your own work involves much more than simply improving your grammar, correcting spelling mistakes or fixing errors in punctuation, although these are important aspects.

Editing is one of the most important skills you will learn as a post-graduate. This session will give you some 'hands-on' advice about revising your work, editing your draft, the role of professional editors, and what examiners expect.
