Workshop

This workshop presented by A/Prof Michele Willson will explore some of the issues involved in the writing/drafting stages of a Masters or PhD dissertation or exegesis, including different approaches and writing styles, inter- or cross-disciplinary research/writing, telling a strong story, and having a sustained argument. A/Prof Willson will also discuss ways of conceptualising your thesis as a whole document rather than as individual sections or chapters.
